OTHER REPORTS

A report on the Adopt-a-Family holiday event was provided. PNA raised \$575 in gift cards and cash for a family in the neighborhood. It was very much appreciated.

NEW BUSINESS

- **Survey Results.** Only 11 responses were received, thus not statistically valid, but may provide some insights since they mirror the same priorities of the 2018 survey. The top three issues facing the neighborhood are 1) mobility (pedestrian) 2) safety/crime prevention 3) maintaining the balance of housing types for all income levels.
- **Homeless Issues:** The City has been successful in moving the houseless out of Burcham and Sandra Shaw parks to other shelters.
- **PNA.** PNA is struggling to provide communication and neighborhood events without funding from the city. Although our bylaws require one meeting per quarter, it is desired that PNA continue with monthly meetings, at least until the summer Potluck. It is key that in order for PNA to carry on that more residents become engaged. Guest speakers may be a draw for attendance, especially if there is an issue that affects PNA residents. Suggestions for guest speakers include the new LMH CEO and someone from the city/county who can explain why property taxes are so high.
- **Elections.** At the February Meeting there will be the election for Vice President and for Secretary. Promotion of these elections needs to be heavy and focused using our website, social media and a postcard. A motion was made to spend our limited funds on a postcard that also promotes how much PNA has accomplished on behalf of its residents. *That PNA sends a postcard in advance of the February meeting detailing its accomplishments and inviting residents to run for an open position on the Board [elections are held at the February meeting]. Motion by P. Miller. 2nd by R. Stumblingbear. Voice Vote. Motion carries.*
- **LAN Dues.** PNA needs to renew its LAN dues. A motion was made. *That PNA authorize the \$25 expenditure for the renewal of LAN dues. Motion by P. Miller; 2nd by A. Shaw. Voice Vote. Motion carries.*

A motion to adjourn was made by R. Stumblingbear, 2nd by P. Miller. Voice/Hand raise vote. Motion carries.
